Bird observations in south Israel March 25-April 2 1997

Erik Hirschfeld (compiler of this list), Thomas Nyberg and Jalle Lorensson visited Israel for a oneweek hardcore birding trip. While Israel was a new destination for Jalle, Erik had made four previous visits and Thomas one. The aim of the trip was to clean up southern Israel. As there is plenty of published information on Israel, this report will just focus on the species list and some general comments. The dates were a bit late for species such as Dunn's Lark, Sinai Rosefinch and Striated Scop's Owl and we therefore missed out on them. But with some luck at least the two former should be possible to see at this time.

Accommodation

We stayed at the Nova apartments, just west of the airport. The standard was high and the apartments were adequately equipped and well-situated. Daily cleaning (and even washing up of dishes!) was included. Among the facilities were an indoor garage and a nursery and the staff were helpful and service-minded. The package deal with flight to Ovda was bought from the Swedish tour operator Always. We also stayed one night in the Park Inn (sounded cheapest!) on the shore of the Dead Sea south of En Gedi. Much overpriced, but convenient when arriving late in the evening. They also arranged an early package breakfast for us. Room and breakfast costed c. USD 60 per person. Cheaper accommodation is available in En Gedi but if you prebook (advisable during spring) you have to arrive before 6 pm (and consequently miss out on valuable birding time...).

Cars, prices etc

We drove 1440 km during the week. Distances in and around Elat are rather short, and it is possible to bird by taxi or walking (better to stay in the hotels near the North Beach and Marina if you plan to bird on foot). A taxi in town costed up to 10 shekels (c. GBP 2 at the time of writing). Petrol was c. GBP 0.7 a litre. We rented a Fiat Punto (four door with ac) from AVIS, pre-booked from Sweden. The car was OK, but more worn than one would expect from AVIS in Europe. Ground clearance was poor, especially with four people in it. It costed us c. GBP200 for the 8 days with unlimited mileage. Remember that if you fly in to Ovda you must pick up your AVIS car in the Elat office (closes 6 pm). Expect two hours transfer time after disembarking the plane to reach Elat town.

Climate and daylight

Unusually cold and windy with temperatures just above 20°C during the days (except for the last days when it soared up to 30°), Nights and mornings were cold, especially in the Negev and wind-proof clothes and gloves are highly recommended for this time of the year. No rain. Dawn was at 6.30 and dusk at 19.00.

General impressions

Elat was very different from EH last visit, in 1989. More hotels had been built, farmers had switched to less atttractive crops (such as grapes) and used more closed greenhouses. A large part of the palm grove had also been destroyed. This, coupled with a poor spring and cold weather, gave an impression of less resting birds than usual, although the variety was large. On the other hand, many interesting places which were unknown in 89, could be found around the kibbutzes in the Arava north of Elat.

Finding sites

Dave Gosney's "Finding birds in Israel" was of great help. Can be ordered from Birdguides, Jack House, Ewden, Sheffield S30 5ZA, tel. ++44 114 283 1002, email dave@birdguides.com, website www.birdguides.com. Watching the video "Gosney in Israel" functioned well as preparation for the trip. Otherwise we used information from the Dutch Birding Travel Report Service (POB 737, NL-9700 Groningen, The Netherlands. Tel. ++31 50 527 4993, fax. 50 527 2668, email Ib.Huysman@net.HCC.nl., internet http://www.mebweb.nl/DBTRS) for making checklists. To go with Elat-resident Hadoram Shirihai (tel and fax++972-7 6379326) for Hume's Tawny Owl is highly recommended. He also does guided trips to other places like the Negev. It costed GBP15 per person for a duetting pair of Hume's in a scenic and quiet wadi with the comet as a backdrop.

Itinerary

"Elat" or "Elat area" refers to any sites north to K20 and in the Elat mountains, e. g. Wadi Schlomo. **25th**: Arrival Ovda airport c. 14.00. To Elat 16.00, then North Beach after picking up the car.

26th: Shulamit Gardens, new lagoon, North Beach, Middle Fields and ringing station, Arava crossing, K20, graveyard, Shulamit gardens, K20, Shulamit gardens, North Beach.

27th: Shulamit gardens, K33, Shizzafon kibbutz, Yotvata, K40, K33, Amran's Pillars, North Beach.

28th: North Beach, Elat area, wadi Schlomo, K20.

29th: Left Elat 5 am. Nizzana, Ashalim, Ben Gurion's grave, Ayn Avdat, Neot Hakkar, En Tamar fishponds. Night by Dead Sea.

30th: Mizpe Drogot, En Tamar fishponds, En Hazeva, Wadi Paran.

31st: Ringing station, K18, K40, Yotvata, Qetura sewage, K20, K18, North Beach.

1st: Elat area, Yotvata, K40, North Beach

2nd: Elat area in the morning. Birding until 9 am, then departure for Ovda.
