## South Australia (SA), Victoria (Vic) and New South Wales (NSW)

This is a report from a combined birding and holiday trip to south-east Australia in the warm and dry summer period. We travelled from Adelaide east to the hot and dry inland of Victoria where we visited Wyperfeld and Hattah-Kulkyne National Parks. From there we left for the coast west of Melbourne known as The Great Ocean Road. After a few days with cooler and more pleasant weather we went inland to visit the areas around Deniliquin before heading for the Blue Mountains and finally the Sydney area. The total number of species came to 242.

We arranged a rental car through Avis in Sweden that we picked up in Adelaide and returned in Sydney 3 weeks later. The cost for this car was 1010 AUD. Most of our nights were spent in motels along the roads, the cost for a double was about 60-80AUD/night. We camped in Wyperfeld and Hattah-Kulkyne National Parks, this was inexpensive but basic.

Eating at restaurants is generally less expensive than in northern Europe. Good fast food is found even in the smallest towns and makes up for a large part of the daily intake

Lonely Planets Australia guide was the one we easily could have coped without. The guide is good, but written for backpackers going for the bigger cities and coastal towns and therefore of little use for birders travelling off the beaten track. When comparing field guides we preferred Pizzey and Knight's to Simpson and Day's "Field guide to the birds of Australia", the former having better plates.

## Site descriptions

## St Kilda (SA)

Easy to reach going north from Adelaide on A1. We birded the fringes of the area, which was OK since our main goal with this trip wasn't shorebirds. To get to the best parts for shorebirds you have to get in touch with local birders who are able to give you access to the area.

## **Belair National Park (SA)**

A small park in the south-east suburbs of Adelaide. We made a short stop here to look for the **Adelaide Rosella**.

## **Granite Island, Victor Harbor (SA)**

Situated on the Fleurieu Peninsula south of Adelaide. This is a good place to see **Little Penguins** as there is a small colony on Granite Island next to Victor Harbor. There are guided tours in the evening (10AUD) and this seems to be the only way to see the penguins as they are out at sea during daytime. Don't expect to see as many penguins here as you do on Phillip Island (Vic), a handful is what you can count on.

## **Coorong National Park (SA)**

We stayed in Meningie, which makes a good base for this area. If you prefer to camp there are campsites near Salt Creek. We birded along the road going west from the town centre towards Narrung, which is good for many wetland species such as **Cape Barren Goose**. Heading south from Meningie along Princes Hwy you will reach Salt Creek from where a loop road starts, a good information board is next to the petrol station. We were lucky to see a pair of **Mallee Fowl** on a working mound, which was signposted along the loop road. Further south along Princes Hwy you can reach the ocean via 42-Mile Crossing, we had **Rufous Bristlebird** and **Elegant Parrots** here. Coorong N.P is not the best place to find large numbers of shorebirds as they are widely scattered along the lagoon.

### Hattah-Kulkyne National Park (Vic)

This is a very good place to find many of the mallee specialities, along the Nowingi Track we had **Mallee Emu-wren**, **Chestnut Quail-thrush** and **Striated Grasswren**. There are nice walking trails near the campsite at Lake Hattah where we camped accompanied by a noisy group of **Apostlebirds**. The campsite is very basic, there are toilets and drinking water but no showers provided. There is a small store on Calder Hwy at the turnoff for the park where you will be able to get some supplies, otherwise Ouyen is the nearest town. ### Wyperfeld National Park (Vic)

This national park is similar to Hattah-Kulkyne N.P, but was slightly greener and we saw lots of kangaroos here. The area to focus on is the Eastern Lookout Nature Drive

from where Dattuck Track and Lowan Track are reached. White-browed Babbler and Red Capped Robin were found along these tracks. There is a basic campsite at the information-centre. Roads and tracks are generally well signposted in both Hattah-Kulkyne N.P and Wyperfeld N.P. Obviously January isn't the best time to visit these parks since it's very hot and dry with lots of annoying flies. The great advantage though is that there will be very few visitors at this time of the year, we didn't meet anyone during four days.

## **Great Ocean Road (Vic)**

This is a well-known tourist route with spectacular scenery and well worth a visit. We stayed two nights in Port Campbell, but there is plenty of accommodation along this stretch of coast. There are a few good species that can be found in this part of Victoria. We ran into a nesting pair of **Hooded Plovers** and saw **Blackfaced Cormorants** at Childer's Cove, which is between Warrnambool and Peterborough. One **Rufous Bristlebird** was heard at The Arch and there is a large colony of **Shorttailed Shearwaters** on Muttonbird Island, just off the coast at Loch Ard Gorge. We where there in mid-January when the birds are breeding and it's spectacular to see the birds come in at dusk, circling overhead before landing on Muttonbird Island. According to the information board there are 25 000 pairs nesting at this site.

## **Sherbrooke Forest, Melbourne (Vic)**

Sherbrooke Forest is part of Dandenong Ranges N.P and is situated near Belgrave, 35km east of the city centre. There are many good trails and this is a good place to see **Superb Lyrebirds**. We were lucky to see five **Blue-winged Parrots**, which according to a local birder are regular in summer. (see map at end of report)

## Deniliquin (NSW)

To get the most out of this area it's best to hire the excellent services of Phil Maher, <a href="http://www.philipmaher.com">http://www.philipmaher.com</a> Phil has a great knowledge of the area and knows where to find the local specialities. We had a full day in the field giving us among others **Black Falcon**, **Superb Parrot**, **Inland Dotterel** and **Pied Honeyeater**. After dark we spotlighted **Plains-wanderer** and **Stubble Quail**.

### **Blue Mountains (NSW)**

We spent one morning going up the Glen Davis road, which starts at Capertee, making stops wherever it looked good. We saw several species of honeyeaters but dipped out on Regent Honeyeater, though we did find two **Double-barred Finches**. This stretch of road can probably be very productive giving it more time than we did. Later in the same day we spent a few hours birding around Echo Point, which is situated near Katoomba, this is where you find the lookout for "The Three Sisters". There are trails starting at the information centre and choosing the ones with fewer people it is possible to round up a few good species, we saw a male **Satin Bowerbird** active by his bower. Nearby is Wenthworth Falls, a steep hillside where we managed to find our only **Pilotbird** for the trip.

## **Barrington Tops National Park (NSW)**

For birders going to Queensland it's not necessary to visit Barrington Tops as many of the species can be more easily found further north. The only exception is Rufous Scrub-bird, which we unfortunately never found, although we did find **Australian Brush-turkey, Wonga-** and **Topknot Pigeon** and **Yellow-throated Scrubwren**. The road description in Thomas & Thomas' book is confusing and we found the best way to get to Barrington Tops is heading north from Newcastle on Pacific Hwy (1) and turning off towards Gloucester. Well before Gloucester the park is signposted "Gloucester Tops N.P", turn off here and follow this road for approximately 30km until you reach the entrance signposted "Barrington Tops N.P". The name of the park on signs seems to change constantly along this stretch. Just after the entrance to the park there is a small campsite where you'll find a good information board over the area. From here the road starts to climb and near the top you'll find Kerripit Road going to the right, pass this road and look for Rufous Scrub-birds on the way to the top.

## **Morton National Park (NSW)**

We only spent an afternoon here at Tianjara Falls where we saw **Rock Warbler** and **Beautiful Firetail**. Tianjara Falls are called Triabunna Falls in Thomas & Thomas' book and the best road (a dirtroad) to get here is to turn off Princes Hwy (1) at Tomerong heading for Sassafras.

## **Barren Grounds (NSW)**

Southwest of Wollongong, between Robertson and Jamberoo. A pleasant place to go birding and fairly easy to get around. It's basically a circular route starting from the parkinglot. We had no problem finding **Eastern Bristlebird** and **Southern Emuwren**. The **Ground Parrots** weren't too co-operative, we only heard two at dusk Camping is not allowed in Barren Grounds, but there is a campsite near Robertson, ask around in town.

## Sydney (NSW)

We did not spend that much time birding in Sydney, but visited Centennial Park that usually holds several species of waterbirds and some passerines. This place can be useful as an introduction for newly arrived birders. Royal Botanic Gardens in central Sydney is also a good spot to kill a few hours, we saw a few **Buff-banded Rails** here.



# Sherbrooke Forest (Dandenong Ranges, Melbourne)



There are several other areas to visit in the Dandenong Ranges but we chose Sherbrooke and found it nice. There are several tracks in this area on both sides of the road and you can easily spend a lot of time here. We were told by a local birder that the **Lyrebirds** were usually easily found in the area between Neumann Track and Hardys Creek. **Blue-winged Parrots** were seen at Brandons Corner, an open grassy area.
