DIARY

1 October

Starting a long journey by entering the plane from Copenhagen to Madrid. Some hours in the air later we have to spend more than four hours at the Madrid airport waiting before the plane to Buenos Aires leaves.

2 October

After a looong uneventful flight over the Atlantic we had to circle Buenos Aires due to heavy thunder storms. After a while we were redirected to Montevideo where we landed in sunshine and clear skies. After a quick refuelling we headed back to our original destination and after quite a bumpy landing we where welcomed by grey skies and Juan Mazar Barnett from Seriemas Nature Tours who were to be our guide for the next couple of days. A quick stop at the hotel for a check in and unpacking of necessary gear, and then out birding in the rain at the nearby Costanera Sur. Since it was Monday the actual recreation/birding area was closed. On sunny days Seriema sometimes can manage a permit on Mondays as well, but due to the bad weather we had to stay outside. This was however the first stay in Argentina for most of us so we had plenty to see by just walking along the canal outside Costanera. Back at the hotel we get to meet Hernan Casañas who will be our guide later in the trip. A very decent meat meal with excellent red Argentinean wine to go with it proves promising for the coming weeks.

3 October

Left for Otamende reserve at 06:00. We had breakfast along the road at a gas station. It's a cloudy and windy day, but fortunately no rain this day. Soon we are scanning the grassy outskirts of Otamende with quite a few good species seen. Not really enough light for good photo opportunities but enough for stunning views of e.g. Many-Coloured Rush Tyrant. We take short walks along the road until we reach the river. At lunch time we head back to the head quarters for the reserve and have our packed lunch there. After a short stroll around the head quarters we drive the 70 km to Ceibas which is a dryer and bushier habitat. The weather has changed now and it is sunny and pleasantly warm. We bird along the road in the afternoon sun and add quite a few good species to our growing list. At about 17:30 we start the two hour drive back to BA. In the city it is cloudy and a bit misty as we arrive at the hotel. Early to bed after a late dinner since we have an early flight to catch tomorrow.

4 October

Left for the airport at 05:00. The plane leaves at 06:45 slightly delayed and we fly over the former Pampas now converted to farmlands. After 1 hour and 40 minutes we arrive at Tucuman. After a trouble free checkout we meet our new driver José. With us all along from BA has Hernan been who will guide us the coming days. We drive through flat agricultural areas with sugar canes, but soon we leave the motor highway and start the climb upwards on winding mountain roads through forest. We make a number of birding stops along the road

and manage to see quite a few new species in this new habitat. In a stream along the road we see our first Rufous-throated Dipper. The weather is mostly sunny and pleasant with the occasional cloud. Soon we leave the forest and pass through a treeless and dry mountain landscape and arrive at our excellent hotel in Tafi de Valle. After a lunch and short siesta we bird the area by the nearby south shores of the artificial lake El Mollar. It is now getting cloudy and windy, but nothing that disturbs birding. The lake and the shore line are fairly rich of birds and we keep ourselves busy until 18:30. Ducks, coots and waders are rather plentiful. Before it gets dark we take a short drive down into the forest again but very low bird activity makes us decide for a return to the hotel and a well deserved dinner.

5 October

Breakfast at 06:00 as we wait for dawn. Outside it is cloudy with a drizzle and bitterly cold. It feels as if we are inside the clouds and the dawn is delayed. At 06:40 we decide to drive upwards into the mountains along the road towards Cafayate despite the visibility being close to zero. At a best we can se some 20 meters ahead in the fog, but still we manage to see several very good birds like *Andean Tinamou*, *Tucuman Mountain-Finch*, *White-Browed Tapaculo* and *Bare-Eyed Ground-Dove*. When we arrive at the pass at 3042 meters above sea level it is still freezingly cold and the foggy air turns into ice drops in the grass, and the fences along the road

were covered in ice. As we descend on the other side of the pass the clouds/fog disappear and soon it is sunny and pleasant. We admire a spectacular cactus landscape where finches are common. A stroll through a small village with some trees and bushes adds new species to the list and lunch with coffee in the stomach. Even further on/down we bird a bushy, sandy and desert like area where the charismatic Sandy Gallito is found. Before we return we scan a dried out river bed from a bridge with a few good birds seen. Going back the same road as we came we surprisingly encounters a large bus load of Canadian birders. From the pass down back to Tafi de Valle we have brilliant evening light and the scenery is stunning. A few new target species like Hellmayr's Pipit, Rufous-Banded and Slender-billed Miner are seen. As we get closer to Tafi de Valle the sun disappears behind the mountains and immediately it gets cold again and the warm sweaters and gloves are put on once more. Back at the hotel the standard procedure is followed with shower, dinner, wine and species list.

6 October

Clear skies and minus degrees meet us this morning. Today we will drive to Cafayate and therefore follow the same road as yesterday. We make a few stops along the same mountain road as yesterday when we see roadside birds, but the first "proper" stop is made in the same desert like area as where we had Sandy Gallito the day before. It is

a crystal clear morning reminding of early spring in Europe with cold air but a warming sun. We search for the endemic *White-throated Cacholote* and are soon rewarded with excellent views. We continue to make strategic birding stops in various habitats in the flat landscape with mountain ridges all around us. At around midday we arrive at Ruinas de Quilmes which is a well known site for ruins from the time of the Indians, but it is also a good place to see *Steinbach's Canastero*. We do so and take to opportunity to get a lunch and a short siesta since it has started to get rather hot. Other interesting species in this area are *Chaco Puffbird*, *Chaco* and *Buff-breasted Earthcreeper*.

As we head on towards Cafayate the landscape changes and more of trees and farmlands turn up and we pass several vineyards. We check in at our hotel in the outskirts of Cafayate at about 15:00 and take a short brake since it is really hot now. We continue our afternoon birding in dryer areas close to town but birding is rather slow. We decide to drive along the famous scenic road towards Salta and admire the stunning rock formations and visit a colony of Burrowing Parrots instead. We act as ordinary tourists for a while and stop for photos of the coloured mountain sides. Back to the hotel for a short pause before dinner in town. We have the dinner consisting of goat at a small and cosy restaurant where the owner picks up a guitar and starts to sing Argentinean folk songs. We are now a long way from home. After this dinner at 22:00 we take a short drive for owls or nightjars but it is dead quiet. We end the daily update of the species list back at the hotel and crash into bed close to

midnight. You have to prepare for long days as a birdwatcher.

7 October

Mainly a transport day to Salta. We drive in the cool clear morning through the same scenery as yesterday, but now sculptured in the morning light. We make a few stops mainly to admire the mountains, but also for a try for crakes in a small roadside marsh. We manage to hear and see Rufoussided Crake while a couple of Plumbeous Rails is well heard but keeps out of sight. A few short stops in drier woods as we descend before we stop for lunch in Abra Cabral. In the afternoon we continue through agricultural areas before we reach Salta and our comfortable hotel Selva Mountain in the hilly and forested outskirts of the town. After check in we take a late afternoon walk from the hotel until dusk and manage to see several good species this way. When it gets dark we take a stroll down hill to a very good restaurant and have too much food and too much wine. Despite all the meat and wine there's always room for a "flan" as well though.

8 October

A full day in the mountains. We leave the hotel in darkness at 06:00 and just make a few short stops in the forest before we start the climb upwards. Again it's a beautiful morning and the air is at a beginning cool and clear. We bird our way upwards in a fairly dry and treeless habitat where bushes are scanned for the specialities for the area. Among others we Rufous-bellied Saltator, Rufous-sided Warbling-Finch, Tufted Tit-Tyrant and Maquis Canastero. The ridges above are regularly patrolled by Andean Condors. We have our packed lunch by a small creak attracting quite a few birds interrupting the eating. Especially photographers have a problem focusing on the food. We continue still upwards to the pass at 3200 m where the habitat slightly changes into a plateau where Andean Flicker and Andean Lapwing are found by the dusty gravel road. We scan this plateau thoroughly and are rewarded with distant views of a pair of Tawny-throated Dotterel. At about 16:00 we turn around and head back the same way as we came. When going down the weather has

changed and it is now foggy and quite chilly. Not much birding is done on the descend, but at a stake-out for *Zimmer's Tapaculo* that we tried on our way up we make a last try with the tape recorder. It takes a while but finally the Tapaculo responds and shows well ending a brilliant birding day. The evening procedure is the same as yesterday with excellent food and excellent wine at the same excellent restaurant.

9 October

Juan has arrived and there will be a switch of tour leaders today. Through the open window in the darkness in the early morning we start the day by hearing a Tropical Screech-Owl and a Grey-necked Wood-Rail by the hotel. We have a decent breakfast and left at 06:45. The first stop in the fine morning is by a small pasture with a creek where there is a lot of bird activity. A Buff-necked Ibis lands in the pasture and among all small birds in the bushes we find the target species for the place, the Black-andchestnut Warbling-Finch. The next stop is by a small lake full of birds like waders, ducks and grebes. Among others Silvery Grebe and Puna Teal are added to the list. Lunch break by another artificial lake with fewer birds. The restaurant is right by the shore line though with very good views of the few birds close by. Local fish on the plates and a pair of Cream-backed Woodpecker in a nearby tree add energy into the group. Transport to Yalan north of Jujuy where Hernan now left us in the caring hands of Juan and heads back home to his family and farm in Cordoba. We continue north

through a valley with magnificent mountain sides on both sides of the road. We are driving towards Huamahuaca and pass through a world heritage. We make only a few stops along the road where there is a little green vegetation at the bottom of the valley while the mountain sides are dry and seemingly empty of life. Strong winds blowing through the valley stirring up dust emphasize the feeling of sterile no-mans-land. We arrive at Huamahuaca situated at 3000 m in late afternoon and the not so cheerful town really fits in with the surroundings and you can't help feeling as you have entered a Clint Eastwood spaghetti western when you go up along the main street. We continue out into the outskirts of the little town and we pass one god forgotten shed after the other before we finally quite surprisingly arrive at the very nice Hostal Azul. A short walk in the surroundings before an early dinner and likewise early bedtime. We have a long and exciting day tomorrow so we need all the sleep we can get at this altitude.

10 October

This day was to become one of the absolute highlights of the trip. The plan was a full day in the high mountain terrain with a visit to Laguno Pozuelos. We left in darkness and again it was cold and clear. The air at these heights is crystal clear and the mornings normally quite cold. When the sun rises it quickly warms like an early spring day in March back in Sweden. We head for Abra Pampa and as usual make a few stops with *Mountain Parakeet* and *Aplomado Falcon* seen. A short stop

at a small lake gives us very good views in beautiful morning light of a few ducks and grebes. Outside the small town Abra Pampa we scan some marshy areas with lots of birds and in the outskirts of the town add the Bright-rumped Yellow-Finch. So far the road has been good, but now we turn into a gravel road towards the lake and this road has seen better days. For two hours we shake our way through these stunning dry lands and have our first encounters with Vicuña. We climb over a low ridge and on the other side the flat landscape called Altiplano stretches out and there the Lake Pozuelos is seen far away. We continue through this strange habitat and manage to find Grey-breasted Seedsnipe and "Puna" Rhea. We drive as close to the lake as we dare considering the fact that it wouldn't be such a good idea to get stuck in the mud out here. Still both the shore line and the birds are far away in the heat haze, but we take a walk and manage to get proper views of the Flamingos needed. Along small canals we get very good views of Andean Avocet and Puna Plover and the day is already a success. No larger coots, however, but these seem to be scarce in this area nowadays and are only seen irregularly when there has been rains. Lunch is eaten by the lake and since we have forgotten the bread it will be Picata Milanese with salad and tomatoes only.

We start to head back the same shaky road and back at Abra Pampa we continue a bit north searching for wetlands. We find one such very good looking wetland with a lot of birds and with excellent views of the Flamingos and waders but still no larger coots. We head towards Yavi and the Bolivian border since the next stop over will be for looking for some Bolivian specialities that can be found in the extreme north of Argentina. Since we are close to the border we are stopped by the police every now and then. We pass through the boring border town Quiaca and Bolivian mountains can be seen far away. We head east to the small town Yavi where we manage to get some late afternoon birding around our hotel. A basic but plentiful dinner ends a long and memorable day.

11 October

After breakfast we take a stroll around the small village. It is quite obvious that we are close to the border and far away from the modern world. Walking the small alleys is like a time travel and it is not hard to imagine what it must have looked like in most parts of the continent some 150 years ago. You have to disregard some wires and modern vehicles of course. Within an hour we have seen the Bolivian specialities that can be found here: Wedgetailed Hillstar, Citron-headed Yellow-Finch and Bare-faced Ground-Dove. The area is surprisingly rich in birds but we leave for the neighbouring village Yavi Chico where about the same species are seen. At 10:00 we start a fairly long transport back to Yala. The only stops are for returning some gear in Huamahuaca and for some lunch in Tilcar consisting of lama meat. A short break after lunch for some souvenir shopping before continuing to our hosteria in Yala where we arrive in late afternoon. After settling in our rooms we head up into some Yungas forest close to Yala. The target species are two species of guan and the spectacular Lyre-tailed Nightjar. A short while before dusk we see the first two and shortly after dusk the latter which is displaying in silhouette against a clear sky with the unbelievable ornaments dangling behind. Back at Patricias and Javiers place at 20:30 for the preordered home made dinner in their living room. A delicious dinner indeed!

12 October

After breakfast we drive up the same road as yesterday. A cloudy morning but our worries for rain prove wrong as the sky clears up and it turns into a warm day. The birding during the morning hours is nice with good birds but mainly re-runs. At noon we take a siesta and lunch back "home" during the hottest hours. Again back up at the hilly road just outside the village and we make a stop by the stream and soon spot a couple of *Dipper* as well as *Torrent Duck*. Again as in the morning nice birding but nothing new. At 19:00 we repeat the procedure from yesterday with a very good home made dinner at Patricias /Javiers.

13 October

Friday thirteenth begins with breakfast at 06.30 and a short morning walk by the same road that we start to know rather good by now. At 09:00 we pack our things and say goodbye to our friendly hosts. They are building their own "hosteria" that should be ready soon so the next time we visit the area it will be possible to stay there. We drive for about two hours down to San Martin and descend from 1700 m down to 700 m and this is quite obvious through the increased heat. A check in at our hotel and a lunch is followed by a siesta since the heat makes birding impossible. By late afternoon it is still very hot but we drive towards Calilegua National Park and bird along the gravel road towards the entrance. It is very quiet and few birds are seen. As we get closer to the entrance we bird by a dried out river and here the bird activity is significantly higher. At the entrance a palaver starts involving some six or seven people. Due to some unclear mistake about our permit for entry of the park our transport firm has to pay a fee. As we understand the actual entrance of the park was at the bridge over the river and since we crossed this without a proper permit the fee has to be paid! After a long discussion we are finally allowed to walk the road inside the gates and are rewarded with a few good birds including two species of *nightjars*. We head back to the hotel and are told that the fine for today so to say covers for our stay in the park tomorrow as well.

14 October

Breakfast at a gas station today before heading back to the park. Today there is no one at the entrance so an arrival this day would have meant no fines! We drive upwards along the winding road through

partly very fine forest and are rewarded with good observations. Among others a magnificent view of a male Giant Antshrike. We continue to about 1600 m and the forest is tall with lichens and bromeliads. The heat affects activity at this height as well so we have to take a brake for a siesta again. Since it is fairly close to the hotel we head back for a few hours. At about 16:00 we return to the park once more and as we drive towards the forest we see a "wall" of black clouds and the heat is by now disturbing. It is obvious that it is building up for a thunder storm and the question is if we have time for some more birding before heavy rain starts. Despite the risk of rain we continue up into the forest once more and goes all the way up to the pass at 1700 m. Heavy wind blow leaves and dust in our faces and a few rain drops falls but we manage to do some birding still. It is very quiet in the forest and probably most of the animals were waiting for the storm to start. We stay until dusk but no owls or nightiars today. As we drive down in the dark we get to see a spectacular thunder storm below us with continuous lightning inside the clouds. It looks like a stroboscope extra large and further down it is very clear looking at the road that it has been raining heavily. Remains of hail are also visible and hopefully this rain means a somewhat clearer air and more bird activity tomorrow. Back in town we also see evidence of the storms and we end a long day with a dinner that is not ready until 23:00.

15 October

Cloudy but no rain and a comfortable temperature today. We drive one or two kilometres into the park and walk slowly back towards the entrance. Yesterday's rain and this morning's cooler

temperature seams to have a positive effect on bird activity. Quite a few good observations including Toco Toucan as well as a Spectacled Owl in daylight. At about midday we are back at the bridge and we decide to end our session at this site and turn back to the hotel for a quick packing of gear before continuing our journey south. Our destination for the day is JV Gonzales and we drive through flat agricultural lands with bushy areas. Soon we make a first stop for a group of Greater Rhea. This group was later followed by more. The most stunning bird observations along this road were otherwise the large flocks of pigeons. The Eared Dove are counted in thousands while Picazuro Pigeon and Picui Ground-dove are counted in hundreds. At one of our stops along the road we witness a goat being run over by a lorry. You sure should stay clear of the road when you bird in this kind of habitat! We arrive at our hotel by 19:30 and after the standard routine of checking in we walk down to a close by square with a decent restaurant.

16 October

After another gas station breakfast we head off for a half an hour drive out into dry bushland habitat called chaco. It's beautiful morning sunlight and good bird activity. Again in the morning there are lots of doves flying around but also a good selection of the dry land species. We walk along some tracks in this thorny habitat and manage to see most of the birds we're after. The one we lack is the Black-legged Seriema and after a while we change tactics and start driving slowly along the tracks with the bus as we play the tape for the seriema. It has become hot and soon we decide to take a siesta and lunch brake. We head back to JV Gonzales for this brake. The lunch is had at "El Gringo" by the plaza. At about 16:00 it is still warm but since it's a dry heat it is manageable so we continue our search in the same area as in the morning. Again we try the method of driving the sandy tracks but soon give this up and start to walk instead. We try a walk along a narrow track in between the thorny bushes and suddenly we hear

the *Seriema* close by. This bird continues to stay frustratingly close but out of sight and we get the impression that it is playing hide and seek with us. Finally it goes quiet and we have to let it go unseen. Before calling it a day we try for night birds after dusk. We are fairly successful with two species of *nightjar* and an *owl* before heading back to the hotel and the packing for tomorrow's flight to BA.

17 October

We get some morning birding in the same area as yesterday with the same species before we start the drive to the airport in Salta at about 08:30. We arrive at the airport at around noon and say goodbye to our excellent driver. One tasteless lunch later we are on the plane and arrive in BA in late afternoon and directly transfer to our hotel. Some problems turns up with our booking for tomorrows flight to Iguazo where we will leave later than planned means we will have time for a morning stroll in Costanera Sur. Free activities this evening and a few of us takes the opportunity to see at least a small part of this big city. We have to admit though that to some extent this small part consisted of a tempting winery where some typical Argentinean wines were bought for transport back to Sweden. A good dinner with good food and good wine ends this transport day.

18 October

We start with a plentiful hotel breakfast at 07:00 before leaving for Costanera Sur. The morning is sunny but windy and a bit chilly. It turns out to be quite a lot of birds, but also a lot of people. The latter meaning that many of the birds are habituated and therefore unafraid and giving possibilities for photos. Some of us work hard with the scopes over the wetlands while others work equally hard with the cameras. The heat increases as we walk along around the ponds.

At about 10:30 we are back at our waiting minibus. Despite the short distance to the airport it takes us a while to get there due to heavy traffic. The delayed flight is scheduled for 11:45, but due

to some technical malfunction there is an additional delay of an hour while a backup plane is found. After an uneventful flight we land through heavy clouds at Iguazo. We quickly enter our waiting minibus and leave for the entrance of the Iguazo falls park. Since this a major tourist attraction there are loads of people at the entrance including several school classes. We walk a short bit before entering a small train (!) taking us to the falls. It starts to rain so we have to admire the impressive falls under umbrellas in this rain. We head back to a coffee shop where we take a rest waiting for the rain to stop. As the rain stops we bird our way back to the entrance adding quite a few species to our list. The clock has become 18:30 and dusk is setting in why we are rather alone in the park. We head for our hotel and check in at about 20:00. When ending this day with a buffet in the hotel restaurant we bump into Gérman, the third owner of Seriemas. He is in the area with an American birding group.

19 October

Early breakfast at the hotel where birders from three different groupes occupy the dining room. Our minibus arrives at 06:30 and we leave for morning birding in a good nearby forest. Yesterdays rain has left the gravel road very slippery. We manage to drive the way though and

since the habitat is new to the trip several birds are as well. Juan proves his good knowledge in Argentinean bird calls and manages to pick out the good species needed and also shows them by using playback. As the heat increases we are reminded that we are in tropical habitat by all the magnificent butterflies. These are attracted by our not so clean and sweaty clothes. We end our last birding day with a visit at a garden with feeders.

Here we get close views of mainly *Hummingbirds* during our half an hour long stay. It's a very pleasant way of ending a trip as we sit still and have all the birds at arms length distance. We pass a gas station on the way to the airport where we manage to reduce the amount of red gravel-road-dirt from our boots. It's only a short distance to the airport and after some repacking we leave for BA on schedule at 14:00. At the airport in BA we are met by a chaos since "Aerolinas" are on strike. We drive to the hotel and later have a very decent final meal with the famous large Argentinean steakes and good Argentinean wine. The final bird log summarize a total of app. 460 species including

heard only. A good number for a trip to northern Argentina.

20 October

Travel day with a 12 hours trip to Madrid where we wait 6 hours before the 3 hours flight to Copenhagen. Some of us have additional train and car transports before returning home so we can feel in the whole body that we have been a long way from home. The visit was however well worth the long travelling hours and Argentina will most certainly see us on a visit again.

447. **Screaming Cowbird** *Molothrus rufoaxillaris*

4 ex Otamendi 3/10, 10 ex en route 4/10, 5 ex en route 7/10 and 75 ex en route 15/10. 15/10 was the great Pigeon day and there were also several hundreds of unidentified Cowbirds en route, Screaming and Shiny.

448. **Shiny Cowbird** *Molothrus bonariensis*

15 days with observations. The most common Cowbird during the trip. Observed in all areas visited except Calilegua NP. The best numbers were "common" in Buenos Aíres area 2-3/10 and en route 4/10 and 200 ex en route to Cuesta del Obispo 8/10.

449. Giant Cowbird Molothrus scaphidura oryzivora
