Kuala Selangor & Berjaya Hills 2015

This is a short note on birding done around Kuala Lumpur. On our main trip to western Sumatra we decided to stay one night on both ways around KL (to where our international flight arrived). We stayed one night in Kuala Selangor, July 25th to 26th and one night in Berjaya Hills, August 7th to 8th respectively.

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Kuala Selangor

A classic birding destination with easy access to mangrove forest and a small patch of coastal secondary forest. There are basic huts at the visitor center. On walking distance there are a few food opportunities in the town center.

Access: By taxi from KLIA, 1h 35 min, 141 RM. We arranged for the same driver to pick us up the following day at 10AM to drive back to KLIA2 for our AirAsia flight to Padang, Sumatra.

Accommodation: Chalet (2 pax), Kuala Selangor Nature Park, 60 RM/night. Booked upon arrival.

Highlights: Little Bronze Cuckoo, Laced Woodpecker, Common Flameback, Sunda Pygmy Woodpecker, Mangrove Whistler, Mangrove Blue Flycatcher, Common Palm Civet. There are very few records of Mangrove Pitta in the last years. Barred Eagle-Owl could occur. A few more migrants would maybe make a winter visit more rewarding.

Sketch map of Kuala Selangor Nature Park. Generally easy birding. There is a broad track going from the main center through secondary forest to the mangrove area where there is a loop track around a wetland. Another short loop stretches out into the mangroves on the western end of the reserve. There is no access to the sea/mudflats as map suggest (platforms broken since long). There are a couple of watching towers.

Best birding around the edge of the secondary forest. Fewer birds inside the mangrove forest, although Mangrove Whistler easy here.

Berjaya Hills

<u>Access</u>: Rental car. There might be public alternatives to reach Berjaya Hills, but you're pretty dependent on a vehicle while there. There are scheduled buses from the hotel to the Japanese Gardens but its inflexible, and you won't be able to get there early in the morning. Driving is straight-forward from KL, following E8 northeast, turnoff toward "Bukit Tingqi"

<u>Accommodation</u>: Unbelievably kitchy Colmare Tropicale Resort was booked online via agoda.com. The resort is a popular weekend destination for KL residents.

Highlights: Mountain Peacock-Pheasant(!), Orange-breasted Trogon, Black-thighed Falconet, Scaly-breasted Bulbul, Buff-breasted Babbler, Purple-naped Sunbird, Pin-tailed Parrotfinch(!), Dusky Leaf Monkey.

Birding: The birding is easy around the Japanese Gardens (Taman Jepun) and Botanical Gardens above the resort. There has been a landslide on the back of the Japanese Gardens which has cut off a small road making it excellent for birding. We found the area pretty birdy on our both visits (one evening and one morning). Late evening we stopped between the Colmare Tropical resort and the gate to the gardens (where there is a very small amusement park "Flying Fox"). On the east side of the road there is a small area previously cleared now grassy where we amazingly had first one and then two Pin-tailed Parrotfinches flying over calling! Good bird to get!

Arrangement: I won't post the exact position of the Mountain Peacock-Pheasant here. This site has been known for a couple of years now, and is probably the only stake-out for the species anywhere. Local birder and photographer Adrian Lim is the one to be contacted, he owns a house close to the resort and have been feeding the pheasants for quite awhile, and usually one or more birds pass through the area most mornings between 7-9AM feeding for a few minutes. They have grown accustomed to birders and the views can be spectacular. Three other local birders where at the same spot on our morning visit, they had brougt a photohide, which is not necessary, as the birds aren't too shy. Rarely also Ferruginous Partridge and Malaysian Rail-Babbler occur in this area. Adrian is careful to claim that he is not a professional guide and won't take any charges. If he can't meet you at the spot (weekends being the best shot), he can give you detailed information. He is a warm and charming person. Thank you for your hospitality!
