Introduction

The north eastern part of India in Arunachal Pradesh and Assam has a much diversified nature, with everything from the swamps and riverbanks connected with Brahmaputra, to the high mountains of Himalaya with rich rain forests on the Himalayan foothills. There is a vast variety of different bird species in the different habitats.

This travel report covers a bird watching trip to Arunachal Pradesh and Assam from March 23th to April 9th 2014.

Main areas visited:

Assam: Dibru Saikhowa National Park (NP), Digboi, Kaziranga NP and Nameri NP

Arunachal Pradesh: Eaglenest Wildlife Sanctuary (WS), Mandala Road, Sangti Valley and Sela Pass

The trip was well organized privately by Lars-Åke Flodin for 6 Swedish birders with the support from Vikram Singh, Wild World India travel agency. Local guides were Peter Lobo and Rofikul Islam from Allindiabirdingtours.com

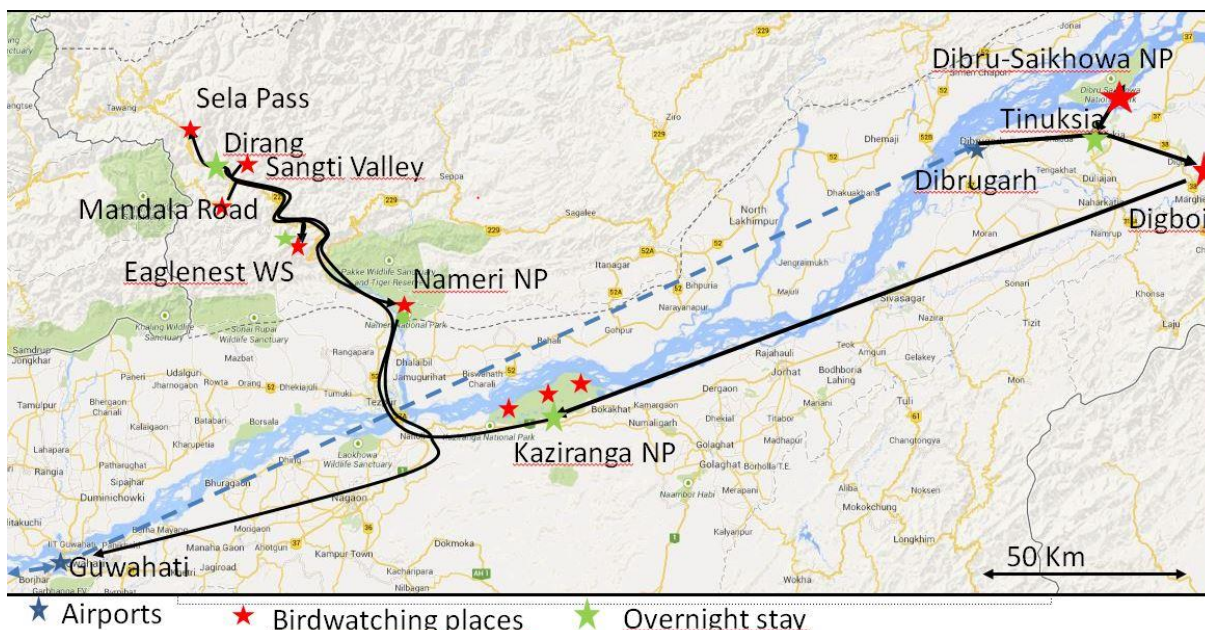

Itinerary:

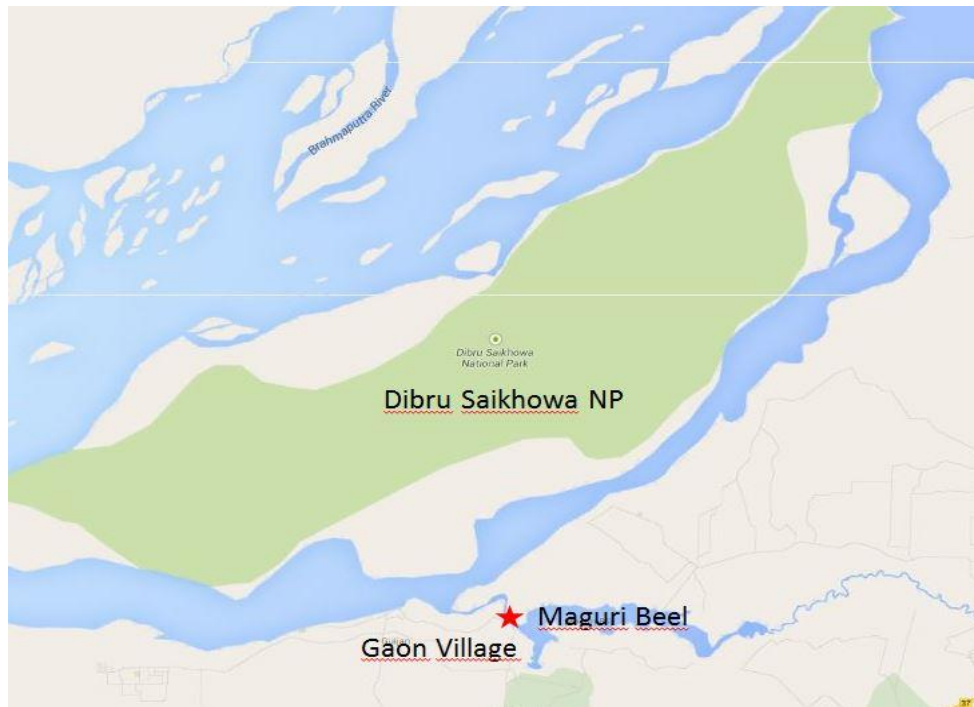
- 23 March: Departure from Gothenburg, Sweden. Flight via Helsingfors, Finland to New Delhi
- 24 March: Arrival to New Delhi early morning. Domestic flight to Dibrugarh (Assam) where our guide Peter Lobo met us with 2 jeeps and the drivers Padam and Basu. Transportation to Hotel Centre Point in Tinsukia. Bird watching started in the evening with a canoe strip in a water hyacinth lagoon in Maguri Beel close to Dibru Saikhowa NP.
- 25 March: Full day bird watching with focus on the specific birds of Dibru Saikhowa NP, Black-breasted Parrotbill, Marsh Babbler and Jerdon's Babbler. Hotel Centre Point in Tinsukia
- 26 March: Dhel-Digboi Elephant Reserve next to Digboi Oilfields in the morning to look for Chestnut-backed Laughingthrush. Transportation to Kaziranga (6h). Hotel Jupuri Ghar.
- 27 March: Kaziranga Central and Western Range. Stayed at Jupuri Ghar
- 28 March: Kaziranga Eastern and Central Range. Stayed at Jupuri Ghar
- 29 March: Transportation to Eaglenest Natural Reserve. Bird watching along the road. Stayed at Lama Camp, Eaglenest.
- 30 March: Eaglenest. Bird watching around Lama Camp. Stayed at Lama Camp
- 31 March: Eaglenest. Bird watching along the road from Lama Camp via Eaglenest Pass to Bompou Camp.
- 1 April: Eaglenest. Bompou – Sissni- Bompou. Stayed at Bompou Camp.
- 2 April: Eaglenest. Bompou – Khellong-Bompou-Cucka -Bompou. Stayed at Bompou Camp.
- 3 April: Transportation from Bompou Camp via Eaglenest Pass, Lama Camp, Tenga to Dirang. Bird watching along the road and in Sangti Valley. Hotel Pemaling in Dirang.
- 4 April: Dirang – Sela Pass- Dirang – Mandala Road (lower parts). Birding at Sela Pass and along the road up and down to the pass. Hotel Pemaling in Dirang.
- 5 April: Mandala Road. Hotel Pemaling in Dirang.
- 6 April: Transportation from Dirang to Nameri National Park. In the afternoon river raft at Jia Boreli river: Stayed at Nameri Eco Camp
- 7 April: Nameri National Park. Stayed at Nameri Eco Camp
- 8 April: Transportation from Nameri NP to Guwahati. Birding along the road at Brahmaputra River and at Deepor Beel Bird Sanctuary (BS) in Guwahati. Flight from Guwahati to New Delhi. Stayed at City Airport hotel in New Delhi.
- 9 April: Birding around the hotel in the morning. Flight back to Gothenburg, Sweden via Helsingfors



24.3. New Delhi – Dibrugarh (Assam), Dibru Saikhowa National Park

Bird watching started directly at the airport. While going from one gate to another we had the Opportunity to spot one Brown Rock Chat and 10 Dusky Crag Martins.

A domestic flight brought us to Dibrugarh, where our guide Peter Lobo and the drivers Padam and Basu picked us up. They brought us to the Central Hotel in Tinsukia. During the drive we observed the standard Indian farmland birds. In the evening we went to Maguri Beel at the border to Dibru Saikhowa National Park.



Maguri Beel is a small river which flows into Brahmaputra and is full of Water Hyacinths. We started at Gaon village and did bird watching in two canoes among Purple Swamphens, Jacanas, Darters, Little Cormorants, several kinds of ducks and herons. A few numbers of waders were also present. Both Lesser and Fulvous Whistling Ducks were quite common and an equal amount of both species. Other highlights at Maguri Beel were: 1 male Pied Harrier, 1 subad Eastern Marsh Harrier, 15 Black-bellied Terns, 10 Whiskered Terns, 1 Pintail Snipe and 1 Zitting Cisticola (heard). We also observed 1 Water Buffalo, 1 Burmese Squirrel and 1 Flying Fox.

25.3 Dibru Saikhowa National Park.

This day was fully aimed for the special birds of Dibru Saikhowa NP, Black-breasted Parrotbill, Marsh Babbler and Jerdon's Babbler. The water level in the Brahmaputra varies a lot during the year and defines if you can have an easy access or not to the area of Black-breasted Parrotbills. At our visit we had to walk a rather long distance to get to the right places. Temperature was up to 35°C and a long part of the walk was on sandy river beds. Nevertheless we came to the right place and heard 2 and shortly saw 1 Black-breasted Parrotbill in the high grass. On the way back we looked for Marsh Babbler. Very hard to see and we could only hear 4 different birds. Meanwhile searching for these birds we had the pleasure to see and hear a lot of other birds like Swamp Francolins (1 heard), 1 Cinnamon Bittern, 20 White-rumped vultures, 4 Himalayan Vultures, 2 Griffon Vultures, 3 Oriental Hornbills, 1 Burmese Shrike, 1 Bengal Bushlark, 5 Sand Larks, 3 Oriental Skylarks, 5 Yellow-bellied Prinias, 5 Chestnut-capped Babblers and 4 Striated Babblers.

Lunch was served at a small restaurant at Gaon Village. During lunch a female Daurian Redstart showed up. Part of the group went for a walk and could pick up a few new species, while the others relaxed in the shadow of the restaurant. A few new bird species occurred even for the relaxing guys

In the afternoon we went to a grass area of Dibru Saikhowa NP. On the way out we also passed the border of the Maguri Beel, so we could have a look over the Water Hyacinths in the river. We saw once again many of the birds observed the day before. The target bird for the afternoon trip was Jerdon's Babbler. We heard and saw 3 birds. Other interesting birds observed in the afternoon were 3 Spotted Bush Warblers and 3 Smokey Warblers.

We also saw 20 Water Buffalos and 2 Leopard tracks.

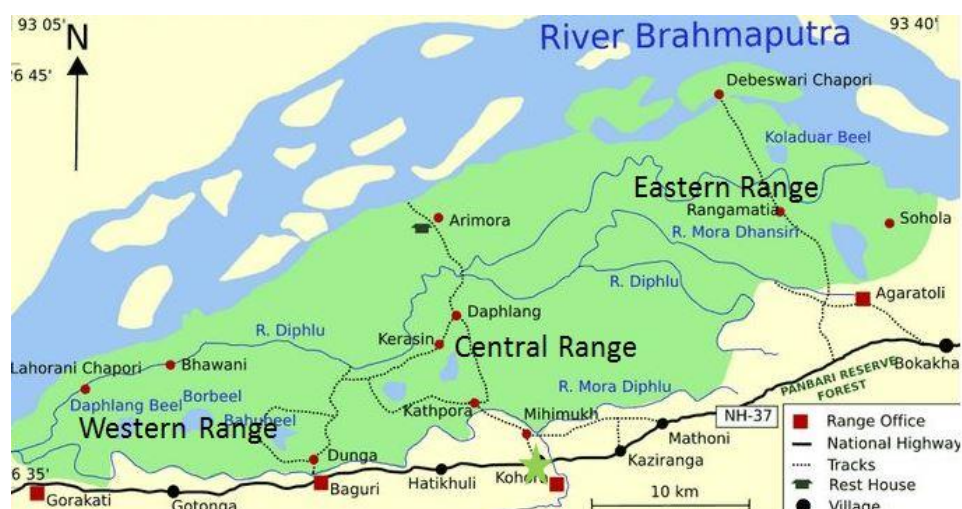
26.3 Digboi – Kaziranga NP

We left early in the morning to Digboi. The target bird was Chestnut-backed Laughingthrush. This morning it rained a little. When we arrived to Dhel-Digboi Elephant Reserve (next to the oilfields) we were enthusiastic about all the birds at the parking place. A lot of Thick-billed Green Pigeons together with 2 Pin-tailed and 3 Yellow-footed Green Pigeons were feeding in a big tree. The local guide Praveen took us into the Elephant reserve in our search for the Chestnut-backed Laughingthrush. After a while 2+1 were seen by some. Later on 1 bird were constantly singing in the dense forest, but impossible to spot. Meanwhile we were listening to the song of the Chestnut-backed Laughingthrush we were closely observed by a White-rumped Shama 2 meters away. A flock of mixed Greater and Lesser Necklaced Laughingthrushes were heard, but also impossible to see. We heard and shortly saw our first playing Grey Peacock Pheasant. Other noticeable birds were Brown-backed Needletail, Scarlet Minivet, Greater Racket-tailed Drongo, Grey and Collared Treepie, Puff-throated Babbler, Large Scimitar Babbler and White-browed Scimitar Babbler. One member of the group also saw 6 Asian Fairy Bluebirds. The rain this morning made the trails slippery.

Some of us heard a Hollock's Gibbon this morning.

In the afternoon we went to Kaziranga National Park. In addition to the normal Indian farmland birds we also saw 10 Great Mynas and some Black-headed Ibises. The drive to Jupuri Ghar resort hotel at Kohora (central admin office of Kaziranga NP) was approximate 300 km and took 6 hours. In the evening at the hotel we saw and heard a Large-tailed Nightjar.

27.3 Kaziranga National Park.



The park opens at 0730 so we had some time in the morning to walk around in the surroundings to the hotel. Mostly tea plantations. Quite some local birds were singing and among those a Plaintive Cuckoo. Breakfast at 0630, departure 0715. The morning trip was in the Central Range of the park. This first Indian Rhinoceros came up on the road 500 m from the gate.

During the whole day we saw a number of these fabulous animals. They were not afraid of cars and we were able to come rather close (10 m). We also saw a number of Swamp Deers, 4 Elephants, Water Buffaloes and an Otter family of 14. This morning we had some heavy rain. We had cars with roof covers so we didn't get that wet. But bird watching got limited from the cars while it was raining. In the afternoon we had a trip to the Western Range of the park. Next to the hotel Jupuri Ghar a Great Hornbill had a nest in a big tree.

Some of the birds observed this day were 1 Cinnamon Bittern, 20 Lesser and 2 Greater Adjutants, Spot-billed Pelicans, Black-necked Storks, Grey-headed Fish Eagles, 1 Red-headed Vulture, 1 Greater Spotted Eagle, 1 Eastern Imperial Eagle, 3 White-throated Needletails and 1 Crimson Sunbird. We also heard 2 Swamp Francolins in the park.

28.3 Kaziranga National Park.

This morning we went up extra early for Elephant rides on the plains to look for Bengal Florican. To watch birds from an elephant is not easy, but you get access to areas which you cannot access in any other way. Unfortunately we did not see any Bengal Florican, but 2 group members on one elephant saw 2-3 King Quails instead.

After breakfast we went to the Eastern Range of the Kaziranga NP. This is the area with most water and where thousands of waterfowls winter. At this time of the year most of them have already left to their breeding areas. In the afternoon we once again went to Central Range to look for Bengal Florican, but without success.

Interesting birds during this day were Black-necked Stork, 1 male Pied Harrier, 4 Grey-headed Lapwing, 11 Eastern Curlew, 1 Brown-headed Gull, 4 Blossom-headed Parakeet, 2 Blue-bearded Bee-eater, 1 Grey-

capped Pygmy Woodpecker, 1 Brown Shrike, 6 Abbott's Babbler, 1 Rufous-necked Laughingthrush and 2 Velvet-fronted Nuthatch nesting close to the road in the Eastern Range. During the day we also saw about 30 Indian Rhinoceros, Swamp Deer, Wild Boar, Hoary-bellied Squirrel, 1 Flying Fox and 1 Himalayan Keelback snake.

29.3 Kaziranga – Lama Camp (2350m) at Eaglenest.

We started very early (0515) in the morning to avoid traffic. The drive was direct towards Lama Camp with only two bird stops planned and the necessary stops at Bhalukpong and Tenga. In Bhalukpong you need to register the entrance to Arunachal Pradesh. One bird stop was below the Sessa village (1150 m). The road goes close to a small forest stream and with dense vegetation. A lot of new birds were seen/heard. Among those were both Slaty-bellied and Gray-bellied Tesia and Long-tailed Sibia. The first Great Barbets were seen and heard. The group learned quickly this song, which we heard every day in Eaglenest WS. Next stop were at a high waterfall (~20 m), next to the road. Here we hoped for Little Forktail, but no luck at this stop. In Tenga we needed to fuel up the cars and bought other necessary beverages before going into Eaglenest WS. Meanwhile the birders saw the first White-capped Redstart in the river and a few Large-billed Crow. The trip from Tenga (1250m) to Lama Camp was unfortunately quite foggy. Lunch was planned at Lama Camp. We arrived 1430. In the evening it cleared up a little and we went on the first birding tour along the road below the camp.

Noticeable new species were Beautiful Sibia, Rufous-backed Sibia, Streak-breasted Scimitar Babbler, Blue-winged Laughingthrush, Striated Laughingthrush, Lesser Shortwing, Brown-flanked Bush Warbler and Grey headed Bullfinch. We also heard the first Large Hawk Cuckoo, which was one of the typical songs heard in Eaglenest WS during this trip. We went to bed quite early to be well prepared for the searching next day of the Lama Camp special bird, the Bugun Liocichla.

30.3 Lama Camp, Eaglenest WS

Bugun Liocichla was the target bird of the day. We searched along the road below Lama Camp. After a while one of the drivers could hear 1bird singing. But we wanted also to see them. They normally go downhill in the morning and uphill in the evening. The best chance to see these birds is when they pass the

road. Normally they move around in the dense under vegetation. But with the help from our experienced guide Peter Lobo, we were able to have very good view of one pair of Bugun Liocichla before they crossed the road on their way uphill.

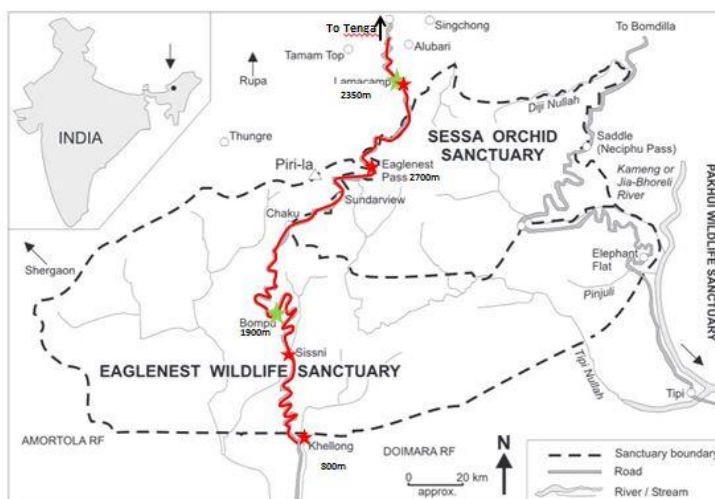

A lot of other interesting birds were also seen or heard like Hill Partridge, Bay Woodpecker, Buff-barred Warbler, Chestnut-crowned Warbler, Scaly-breasted Wren Babbler, Pygmy Wren Babbler, Rufous-throated Wren Babbler, Long-billed Wren Babbler, Striated Laughingthrush, Grey-sided Laughingthrush, Bhutan Laughingthrush, Scaly Laughingthrush, Rusty-fronted Barwing, Purple Cochoa, Tibetan Siskin, Red-headed Bullfinch, Golden-naped Finch etc. In other words quite a rewarding birding day.

31.3 Lama Camp (2350m) – Eaglenest Pass (2700m)– Bompu Camp (1900m), Eaglenest WS

Bird watching in Eaglenest WS is quite fantastic. You cover altitudes from 800 m – 2700 m on one road. In practice this means you walk, mostly downhill, parts of the road while the drivers wait in the cars. Then you drive to a new part of the road. The forest is untouched and you can see elephant tracks all over. The elephants are down in the Brahmaputra valley in wintertime and walk up on the hillside, even to Eaglenest Pass to spend the summer on higher altitudes.



This morning we left Lama Camp around 0545. We drove directly to Eaglenest Pass, where the target bird was Brown Parrotbill. But we were without luck on this bird at this place. However among Rhododendron, Magnolia trees and bamboo we saw two Fire-tailed Myzornis very good.

When we had passed Eaglenest Pass and started to descend down to Bompu at one stop we could see Bar-winged Wren Babbler and the nice Slender-billed Scimitar Babbler. We stopped at several places and looked for Ward's Trogon, but without success. Lunch at Bompu and in the afternoon we went back on the same road again up to Chaku looking for Ward's Trogon. No success. However we were able to come as close as 2-3 m from a singing Rufous-throated Wren Babbler. That was a beautiful sighting.

Other interesting birds this day were Black Eagle, Himalayan Buzzard, Mountain Scops Owl, Mountain Tailorbird, Chestnut-headed Tesia, Slaty-bellied Tesia, Grey-bellied Tesia, Rufous-faced Warbler, White-spectacled Warbler, White-browed Scimitar Babbler, Black-faced Laughingthrush, Yellow-throated Fulvetta, Rufous-winged Fulvetta, Scarlett-backed Flowerpecker, Mrs Gould's Sunbird and Dark-breasted Rosefinch.

We said goodbye to our guide Peter Lobo and thanked him for a pleasant and rewarding week. Our new guide, Rofikul Islam, was welcomed by the group

1.4 Bompu (1900m) – Sissni (1250m) – Bompu, Eaglenest WS.

As always an early start. We left the camp at 0515 in the dawn. Target birds this day were Rufous-necked Hornbill, Beautiful Nuthatch and Himalayan Wedge-billed Wren Babbler. This day we were luckier and saw all of them in a good way. One Wedge-billed Wren Babbler was singing 3m away, but in dense under vegetation with a lot of branches between us and the bird. This was one of many exiting sightings we had during the trip. While we were looking at a Long-billed Wren Babbler a pair of Rufous-necked Hornbills flew over and landed in a tree right above us for a while. Magnificent birds.

Later on we were also able to spot 2+2 Beautiful Nuthatches and 3 Brown Bullfinches.

We also had the opportunity to see one Rufous-throated Partridge and two Chestnut-breasted Partridges were also heard later on. Red-faced Liocichla and Scarlet Finch were added to the list of spectacular birds. Other interesting observations were Rufous-bellied Eagle, Crested Goshawk, Mountain Hawk Eagle, Himalayan Wood Owl, Mountain Imperial Pigeon, Grey-chinned Minivet, Lesser Racket-tailed Drongo, Maroon Oriole, Green Magpie, Sultan Tit, Mountain Bulbul, Black-throated Prinia, Grey Hooded Warbler, White Crested Laughingthrush, Silver Eared Mesia, Lesser Shortwing, Spotted Forktail, Rufous Gorgeted Flycatcher, White Gorgeted Flycatcher and Slaty Blue Flycatcher.

2.4 Bompu (1900m)- Khellong (800m), Bompu –Chaku (2400m)

This morning we started at 0415 aiming to the lower regions between Sissni and Khellong to look for birds in the bamboo area. A number of new birds were seen or heard like Hodgson's Frogmouth (1 call was heard), Speckled Piculet, Pale-headed Woodpecker (2 heard), Rufous Woodpecker, Long-tailed Broadbill, Silver-breasted Broadbill (1 heard), Black-naped Monarch, Yellow-browed Tit, a flock of 30 White-hooded Babbler, Yellow-vented Warbler, Yellow-bellied Warbler, Eyebrowed Wren Babbler (2 heard), Grey-throated Babbler, Red-billed Scimitar Babbler, Lesser and Greater Rufous-headed Parrotbill, Pale Blue Flycatcher and Slaty-backed Forktail

Lunch at Bompu and then in the afternoon we went higher up towards Chaku (2400) with focus on Ward's Trogon and Cutia. Still no luck with Ward's Trogon but we saw 7 Cutias very well and lots of pictures were taken. We also heard once more a Chestnut-breasted Partridge. Another target bird for this trip was Blyth's Tragopan. One member in the group was able to see a glimpse of a female, while the others despite 30 min waiting only could hear it walking around on the ground.

3.4 Bompü – Eaglenest Pass (2700m) – Tenga (1500m) - Dirang (1500m)

This was our last day in Eaglenest WS. We left the camp at 0500 to go to Dirang. On the way we stopped at several places looking for the Ward's Trogon. Finally at one of the stops a male was calling and we could have a beautiful view of this magnificent bird for 10 minutes.

At Eaglenest Pass we had an excellent sighting of two Spotted Laughingthrushes. No Brown Parrotbill at Eaglenest Pass this time either. Other interesting observations in Eaglenest were Yellow-billed Blue Magpie, Spotted Nutcracker, Chestnut-crowned Laughingthrush, Hoary-throated Barwing, Black-headed Shrike Babbler, Large Niltava, Alpine Accentor and Little Bunting.

Well down in Tenga and after necessary refill of fuel we went towards to Dirang. First a short stop at a side river to the Kameng River where we saw three Ibisbills, two Crested Kingfishers, Brown Dipper and Plumbeous Redstart. Closer to Dirang a female Wallcreeper was sitting on a cliff wall next to the road.

As we had some time left we took the opportunity to visit Sangti Valley before going to the hotel in Dirang. In the valley we saw the Long-billed Plover and Hodgson's Redstart at the river banks.

Well at the hotel Pemaling in Dirang it was nice to have a shower again, get some clothes washed and try to connect to Internet, which maybe was available for an hour at the reception.

Next day was planned for Sela Pass, i.e. a very early start, so it was time to go to bed early.

4.4 Dirang (1500m) – Sela Pass (4100m) – Dirang – lower parts of Mandala Road

We started the drive to Sela Pass at 0330. First stop was at 0600 and we looked for Blood Pheasant. We could hear one, but not see it. After going a little higher we could see 4 of them. Good start. The weather was cloudy and foggy in the morning, but now it started to clear up. Sometimes it was clear and we were above the clouds, but the next moment the clouds came back and the visibility was once again lower. There was snow on the ground and ice on the roads. There were some busses having problems on the road. However the weather got better and better. At some moments we had an excellent view of the Himalayan Mountains.

Closer to Sela Pass at another stop 7 Snow Partridges were close to the road, 30 Snow Pigeons, 5 Red-billed Coughs and 1 female of Grandala passed by. Unfortunately we didn't have the luck to have a close look at a male Grandala. Next stop revealed a pair of Himalayan Monal, 1 Fulvous Parrotbill, 1 Hodgson's Treecreeper, a flock of 100 Plain Mountain Finches and 30 Tibetan Siskins.

At the summit of Sela Pass it was quite foggy and nothing special was seen, except some Rosy Pipits. On the way back we saw Coal Tit, Grey-crested Tit, Rufous-vented Tit, Brown-throated Fulvetta, White-browed Rosefinch and White-winged Grosbeak.

Back at the hotel we were surprised by seeing 3 Blue-capped Rock Thrushes in the hotel garden. Other birds flying around the hotel were Yellow-breasted Green Finches.

The afternoon tour was to the lower parts of Mandala Road. Here we had Indian Cuckoo, Russet Bush Warbler, Tickell's Thrush, Chestnut Thrush, Grey Bush Chat, Blue-throated Blue Flycatcher, Ultramarine Flycatcher, Dark-sided Flycatcher, Fire-breasted Flowerpecker and Russet Sparrow.

During this day we were also lucky to spot 3 Black-tailed Crakes at one place.

5.4 Dirang (1500m) – Mandala Pass (3200m) – Dirang

Early start at 0530. Clear blue sky all the way up to the top. Fantastic view of the Himalayan mountain range.

At the higher altitudes quite some logging has been done and is still ongoing. But still a lot of interesting birds can be seen. We started bird watching at the top and then gradually moved down the road back to Dirang. Some of the different birds we observed during this trip were Himalayan Vulture, Indian Cuckoo, Rufous-bellied Woodpecker, Black-naped Monarch, Yellow-billed Blue Magpie, Grey Treepie, Collared Treepie, Spotted Nutcracker, Rufous-fronted Tit, Black-throated Prinia, Pygmy Wren Babbler (1 heard), Bar-winged Wren Babbler (1 heard), White-throated Laughingthrush, two Rufous-chinned Laughingthrushes (we were lucky to see 2 of them. normally you only hear them), Grey-sided Laughingthrush, Black-faced Laughingthrush, Chestnut-crowned Laughingthrush, Brown-throated Fulvetta, Black-throated Parrotbill, Brown Parrotbill (2 heard), Rusty-flanked Treecreeper, Dark-throated Thrush, Golden Bush Robin, Pygmy Blue Flycatcher, Mrs Gould's Sunbird, Black-throated Sunbird, Fire-tailed Sunbird, Maroon-backed Accentor, Blandford's Rosefinch, Grey-headed Bullfinch and Golden-naped Finch. Quite an impressive birding day.

6.4 Dirang – Nameri National Park

We left early (0400) in the morning to drive to Nameri National Park. The ambition was to have lunch at Nameri Eco Camp and then do the river rafting in Jia-Bhoreli River in the afternoon. Naturally we did a number of stops on the way. Some interesting birds were seen like Asian Emerald Cuckoo, Long-tailed Broadbill, Buff-breasted Babbler, Pin-striped Tit Babbler, Rufous-fronted Babbler, Coral-billed Scimitar Babbler, White-tailed Robin (1 heard) and Asian Fairy Bluebird.

Well at the Nameri Eco Camp we had lunch and after that we left for the river rafting in the Jia-Bhoreli River. We did not see as many birds as expected but we saw among others two Striated Herons, 6 Black Storks, one Ibisbill, River Lapwing, River Tern, Small Practincole and Dollarbird.

7.4 Nameri National Park (150m)

Early morning as usual. In Nameri NP you need to have two armed guards with you for your protection against elephants and other bigger mammals. After crossing the river at 0630 we walked on the sandy riverbed towards the guard administration building at the NP border. Just before we came to the administration office another guide rushed towards us. He informed us that two White-winged Ducks were sitting on a branch high up in a tree next to the office. What a luck we had! The main target bird for Nameri NP was seen even before we started. We had a good look at these ducks for at least 15 minutes before they flow away.

So instead of visiting X number of ponds in the forest searching for this bird we went deeper into the forest focusing on other birds. One tour in the morning and one in the afternoon. Interesting birds observed were: White-cheeked Partridge (2 heard), Ruddy-breasted Crake, Great Thick-knee, Barred Cuckoo-Dove, Wedge-tailed Green Pidgeon, Emerald Dove, Vernal Hanging Parrot, Green-billed Malkoa, Stork-billed Kingfisher, Great Hornbill, Wreathed Hornbill, Rufous Woodpecker, Lesser Yellownap, Greater Goldenback, Black-crested Bulbul, Thick-billed Warbler (1 heard), Siberian Rubythroat, Black-backed Forktail, Taiga Flycatcher, Pale-chinned Blue Flycatcher, Plain Flowerpecker and Ruby-cheeked Sunbird.

In the morning we saw tiger tracks on the trail next to the river. Mammals seen were two Elephants, one Muntjac, one Gaur, a Wild Boar family of 7, 20 Black-capped Langures, 10 Assam Macaques, 10 Rhesus Macaques, one Himalayan Giant Squirrel and one Mongoose.

In the night we could go to sleep listening to the song of Brown Hawk Owl and Asian Barred Owllet.

8.4 Nameri NP – Guwahati

We started at 0500 by walking down to the Jia-Bhoreli River. Noticeable birds seen were one Oriental Hobby, Spotted Owllet (1 heard), Crimson Sunbird and Siberian Rubythroat.

Time to take off for home. Our first stop was at the crossing of Brahmaputra River. Observations to highlight are Ferruginous Duck, Brown-headed Gull, Whiskered Tern, Thick-billed Warbler (1 heard) and other ducks, egrets, herons and Little Grebes.

Our last stop was at Deepor Beel Bird Sanctuary in Guwahati. This is a water land filled with Water Hyacinths, next to Guwahati city dump. The environment is very similar to the first day at Maguri Beel at Dibru-Saikhowa. Interesting observations were Cotton Pygmy Goose, Lesser and Greater Adjutants and two Black-eared Kites were identified among all Black Kites.

After lunch it was time to say good-bye to our excellent guide Rofikul Islam, our very good drivers Padam and Basu and to head home again via New Delhi.

9.4 New Delhi City Airport Hotel.

Three of us in the group had not given up birding yet. An early walk in the surroundings of the hotel revealed some new birds like Indian Peafowl, Laughing Dove, Indian Grey Hornbill, Brown-throated Barbet, White-eared Bulbul, Bank Myna, Rosy Starling and Indian Silverbill.

Summary

In total the group all together observed 503 bird species. It was 17 hectic days with birding from early morning to late evening. Of course this good result could not have been achieved without the help of our excellent guides Peter Lobo and Rofikul Islam, Allindiabirdingtours.com, and the drivers Padam and Basu. We are also very grateful to Vikram Singh, Wild World India travel agency, who had organized the tour in an excellent way.
